JANUARY	Still in Covid Lockdown church services are held on zoom There is a campaign to save the Village Pub, "The Manor" (the owners wanted to close and change it to private house). Tendring District Council have registered it as an Asset of Community
FEBRUARY	A vintage Leyland bus, parked in Pork Lane has had its windscreen and a window smashed. The bus is often used for charity events
MARCH	Villagers have raised enough money to buy Pub, negotiations are with owners 27th March - a Spring Art Exhibition is held in Village Hall
APRIL	A double decker bus strikes Kirby Bridge but no injuries to passengers Covid restrictions slowly easing
MAY	The Village is brightened up with colourful spring flowers along the roadside through the village
JUNE	Amazing response from Villagers to buy shares or give donations to save "The Manor". A price is now agreed with vendors
JULY	After running a pole of suggestions, it is decided to revert the name of the pub back to "The Ship Inn".
AUGUST	Local Doctors' Surgery will maintain Covid rules Excessive Flooding under railway bridge - road blocked with broken down car Methodist Church starts open air Coffee Mornings, weather permitting
SEPTEMBER	Recent Art Exhibition Dairy Farm had fire in outbuilding 1st time allowed to sing (wearing masks) in church
OCTOBER	The Ship Inn has opened from 15th October, with the Community running it 30 m.p.h. speed limit brought in on Kirby Road 50th Anniversary of Opening E.W.T. Pits Nature Reserve, Lt. Clacton Rd.
NOVEMBER	There have been many building applications - most have been refused on grounds they are outside the development boundary
DECEMBER	Coffee mornings started inside the Methodist church on Thursday Mornings lots of Activities being held at 'The Ship' and 'The Village Hall'
