JANUARY

Former Palma Nova, Kings Avenue, sea end, has a planning application to be a convenience store with flats above.

FEBRUARY

The closed 'Clacton Market' re-opens at the Holland Public Hall on Saturday's

MARCH

Works at York House, with window frames being removed. The property has been empty for some time.

APRIL

MAY

JUNE

The 'Art Deco' block of apartments on the Kings Parade is shrouded by scaffolding. (Sovereign Court)

The month was the hottest on record.

JULY

Sovereign Court flats are in scaffolding.

AUGUST

A motor launch was washed up on the beach and abandoned. Some while later it was removed.

On 30th the Co-op Daily store on Frinton Road closes. Due to re-open as a Spar store.

Officially the warmest summer on record.

SEPTEMBER

An earthen bank placed around the perimeter of the public open space between Lyndhurst Road and Hazlemere Road. Additionally later also, another made around the Village Green, Brighton Road. The purpose is to deter access by vehicles.

OCTOBER

Centenary of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in Kings Avenue marked. The Minister is Rev. Steve Sutton,
